# A. FISHERMEN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



Fishermen Community Development Programme is an organization which works to improve the lives of fishermen in Kollam's coastal region on all fronts. This organization makes every possible effort to support the fishermen in enhancing their social life, economic standard, health, education, and cultural practices. It helps the recipients create a stable source of income for their own households, thereby eradicating poverty.

#### 1.1 Self-help groups

FCDP makes use of its SHG Groups to run the microfinancing activities. There are two major groups – Fishermen Group and Non-fishermen Group in the six sections of coastal Kollam from Thangassery to Mundackal.

#### 1.2. Credit Schemes


Credit is made available to the members of FCDP as Credit Union, New Credit Union, Ashakiran credit, and RF credit. The primary goal of the microcredit activities is to provide members with loans for work-related expenses. The loan committee, which is made up of members of the governing body who represent different sections, processes and approves loan requests.



The table below represents the credit given and repayment received in the financial year 2023-2024.

The goal for which credits were granted is depicted in the diagram below. These include marriage, buying fishing equipments, paying off debt, house maintenance, and running business. The majority of loans have been taken out to buy fishing equipments.

The Saving schemes are made available for the members which include Ashakiran Savings, Special Savings and Small Savings and encourage members to develop an aptitude to save money.

#### **B. THEERADESA MAHILA SOCIETY**




Established in 1983, Theeradesa Mahila Society (TMS) aims to empower women in the Kollam coastal region through social, cultural, economic, employment, health, and awareness development. The women of the coastal belt started practicing thrift and saving money with the help of this organization. TMS supports women in recognizing and defending their own rights, the need for justice, involvement in the community, and entrepreneurship. Financial inclusion initiatives of TMS are limited to women alone and are intended to improve their financial standing and encourage saving. This is run in nine sections, from Thangassery to Eravipuram.

#### 2.1 Self Help Groups

Financial inclusion activities of TMS are organized through self-help groups. There are 1433 members with 65 self-help groups in 9 sections from Eravipuram to Thangassery.

Given below is the number of members in each section in the financial year 2023-2024.




#### 2.2 Credit Schemes

Members apply for loans under a number of schemes, all of which have the express purpose of promoting self-employment. Under Ashakiran Credit and Credit Union, women are granted credit. Credit requests of the members are initially reviewed by the Self Help Groups before being approved by the loan committee, which is formed of board members from different sections.

The table below represents the credit given and repayment received in the financial year 2023-2024.

The following chart illustrates the different justifications for credit usage. Fresh and dried fish vendors, flour mills, clothing sales, candle makers, snack makers, beauty salons, tailors, petty shops, tea booths, and so on are examples of small enterprises. Boat, net, and engine maintenance have also been paid for with money. In addition, credit has been used for permanent house construction, education, healthcare, and retail operations (stationery, groceries, seafood, kerosene, etc.). It is significant to remember that the majority of loans are taken out with the intention of paying off prior debts.



#### 2.3 Saving Schemes

Saving schemes under TMS include Ashakiran savings, extra savings and small savings. During the year 2023-2024, total of Rs. 3,06,96,686.00 (Three crore six lakhs ninety-six thousand six hundred and eighty-six rupees only) was saved under various schemes.

#### C. SOCIAL OUTREACH ACTIVITIES



The various social outreach activities of FCDP, TMS, FCDS (Fishermen Community Development Society), and DBYF (Don Bosco Youth Forum) include Vishappinu vida, Santhwanam, Pratheeksha, Ujjivani, free counseling service and Free legal aid. During the year 2023-2024, Rs. 3732709 (Rupees thirty seven lakhs thirty two thousand seven hundred and nine only) have been spent on social outreach activities.

During the year 2023-2024, 41400 food packets were distributed to the needy and the deserving people at their homes. An average of 115 packets were distributed daily.

2805906 (Twenty-eight lakhs five thousand nine hundred and six rupees only) have been spent towards daily meal and nursing care. The project completed its seventh year of reaching out to the needlest of people in Kollam coastal region. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all those kind hearted benefactors who support this programme with love and sacrifice.

#### 3.2 Pratheeksha (Educational Aid)

Pratheeksha which aims to provide educational aid to poor and eligible students reaches out to children in need. In the year 2023- 2024 Rs. 97782 (rupees ninety-seven thousand seven hundred and eighty-two only) was spent as part of the programme as scholarship and educational aid.



#### 3.3 Santhwanam (Empathy and Care)



Santhwanam reaches out to the sick and needy through medical assistance and nursing care. In the financial year 2023-2024, 45 members were provided medical assistance. Rs. 542038/- (Rupees five lakh forty-two thousand and thirty-eight only) was spent towards succoring the sick.

#### 3.4 Ujjivani (Free Dialysis)

It provides free dialysis for kidney patients. Ujjivani was inaugurated by Rt. Rev. Dr. Paul Mullassery, (Bishop of Kollam) on 24 May 2022. The program supports 100 free dialysis every month. The project began with the help of local benefactors and is organized in collaboration with Bishop Benziger hospital, Kollam. During the year 1078 free dialysis have been given to 40 patients, amounting to a total of Rs. 539000 (Rupees five lakh thirty-nine thousand only).





#### 3.5 Community health Centre

Community Health Centre, run in collaboration with Bishop Benziger Hospital and Bishop Benziger College of Nursing, was renovated and reopened on 3 October 2022. Rt. Rev. Dr. Paul Antony Mullassery, Bishop of Quilon Diocese inaugurated the function and blessed the newly renovated centre. Rev. Fr. John Britto (Director, Bishop Benziger Hospital) welcomed the guests at the event organized at the Community Health Center at 10 am.

#### 3.6 Medical Camps

#### FREE MEDICAL CAMP FOR WOMEN

The Lifeline Fertility and Well Women Center, in collaboration with FCDP and TMS, organized a free medical camp on 5 August, 2023, at FCDP Hall, focusing on gynaecological issues. Mr. Tomy N. (Ward Councillor) inaugurated the camp. The camp provided gynaecological consultations, medicines, routine tests, and valuable health information. Over 100 women benefited from the free medical camp.





#### FREE MEDICAL CAMP FOR DIABETES CHECK-UP

Shifa Medical Centre, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Quilon West End and the Fishermen Community Development program Kollam, organized a free diabetes check-up and awareness class at FCDP Hall on November 14, 2023. The camp focused on issues related to diabetes. Tests were provided on blood sugar, HbA1c, and diabetic neuropathy. About 40 members participated in the camp. Our sincere appreciation to the doctors, nurses, and staff who assisted at the camp. Besides offering free medical services, the camp was also useful in disseminating information on health-related matters.





#### FREE PRIMARY CHECK-UP MEDICAL CAMP

Fishermen Community Development Programme Kollam in collaboration with Rotary Club of Quilon Heritage & Muthoot Snehasraya organized a free medical camp at FCDP Hall on December 31, 2023. Tests were provided on Glucose, creatinine, cholesterol, blood pressure, urine albumin urine sugar and BMI. The facilities were made available to first 120 persons who registered. Our sincere appreciation goes to the doctors, nurses, and staff who assisted at the camp. Besides offering free medical services, the camp was also useful in disseminating information on health-related areas.

#### F. FISHERMEN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY

Fishermen Community Development Society (FCDS) is a registered society to provide a platform for marketing the goods and services produced by the micro enterprises begun by the women of the coastal region of Kollam. The products include powder and masala, home care products, handicraft, paper and clothe bags, and garments.



#### **Masala and Food Products**

Masala and Food Products unit offers unadulterated food powder, namely sambar powder, garam masala, chicken masala, meat masala, fish masala, pepper powder, chilly powder (red chilly and kashmiri), coriander powder, turmeric powder, rice flour and wheat flour and spices like pepper, cardamom and honey.

#### **Home Care Unit**

The home care unit produces sanitary products which include bathing soap, hand wash, hi-tech and normal washing powder, toilet cleaner, phenyl, dish wash liquid, floor cleaner, detergent liquid, sanitizer and kits for the same.





#### **Handicraft Unit**

FCDS started a unique business producing seashell-based crafts. The program is advantageous from an economic standpoint as well as in terms of personality development because it teaches the members how to expand and realize their imagination and use their free time in inventive ways.



#### **Cloth and Paper Bag Units**

With an eye toward a plastic-free and environmentally responsible future, FCDS produces cloth bags and paper bags, which are distributed to store owners in and around Kollam. The paper bag unit was started after the training that was conducted as part of the EDP training programme. Bags are offered in various configurations and at various prices.



#### **SHG Outlet**

The SHG outlet was established as a channel for selling the goods that the various production units produce. Masalas, home care products like dishwash liquid, floor cleaner, sanitizer, etc., clothing, masks, cloth bags, and other supplies like pickles, honey, rice, cooking oil, milk, candles, and handicraft items are all included. The store is open on every working day, from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm. The units also deliver its merchandise in response to consumer requests.



#### **G. WE-LIVE**

First phase of the project "Women Empowerment through Livelihood Entrepreneurship" (WE-Live) has been a success in mainstreaming the women of coastal Kollam by helping them to become financially independent. Second phase of two-year project began in March 2023. Various workshops were organized with the aim to empower the women of the coastal region to achieve a sustainable income through entrepreneurship and selfemployment. Entrepreneurs undergo five workshops covering Group Management, Finance Management, Credit Linkage and Finance Access, Production Management 1 and Production Management 2. The organic kitchen segment involves three workshops covering Basics of Organic Farming, How to Start Kitchen Garden in Organic way, and Basics of Vegetable Cultivation. The WE-LivE Project is dedicated to ensuring sustained income for women by fostering entrepreneurship and promoting organic kitchen practices.

#### H. WOMEN AND YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME (WYEP)

The project aims to enhance the entrepreneurial skills of 450 women and youth within 2 years through skill training and entrepreneurship development. It includes support for setting up income-generating projects, improving market accessibility, and enhancing leadership in coastal villages of Kollam.

- Computer class

With a focus on creating entrepreneurs.

Entrepreneurship Development Training Marketing and Support provided. The project plans to train 225 women/youth annually in three skill domains.

Leadership training classes were successfully conducted, benefiting over 400 Self-Help Group (SHG) leaders. These efforts aim to empower individuals and foster economic growth in the region.
